

## Genocide Warning: Israel, July 2024

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Since October 8, 2023, Israel and Hezbollah have been <u>engaged in constant conflict</u>. Hezbollah has launched <u>regular rocket attacks into northern Israel</u>. Israel has <u>bombed Hezbollah positions in</u> <u>southern Lebanon in response</u>. Hezbollah claims its rocket attacks on Israeli towns are in <u>solidarity with</u> <u>Palestinians in Gaza</u>. The attacks <u>have driven Israelis from several northern towns</u>.

Israel has sent precision missiles into Lebanon and Syria that <u>have killed several senior Hezbollah</u> <u>leaders</u>. Hezbollah has responded with <u>more rocket attacks</u> on Israel. Israeli leaders are now planning an invasion of Lebanon to stop Hezbollah attacks. Israel <u>may try to establish an Israeli-controlled buffer zone</u> in southern Lebanon.

Israel refuses to rule out an invasion of Lebanon until <u>Hezbollah ends its attacks in northern</u> <u>Israel</u>. Hezbollah refuses to end its attacks against Israel <u>until the Israeli Defense Force (IDF) ends its war</u> <u>in Gaza</u>, which Israel refuses to do <u>until it totally defeats Hamas and all Israeli hostages are freed</u>.

On June 18, the IDF approved <u>operational plans for an invasion of Lebanon</u>. This escalation of the conflict would force Israel into a multi-front war and violate <u>UNSC Resolution 1701</u>.

Israeli missile strikes and shelling have already <u>cut agricultural output in southern Lebanon</u>. <u>Syrian refugees</u> and Lebanese <u>Christians</u> and Muslims in southern Lebanon are moving further north and abroad. <u>Israel's phosphorus munitions</u>, banned under international law, have <u>burned and poisoned</u> <u>southern Lebanese farmland and orchards</u>.

<u>Netanyahu has dissolved his unity war cabinet</u> and <u>split with moderate politicians</u>. There are now <u>large demonstrations calling for new elections</u>. Netanyahu rejects elections because of <u>his almost certain</u> <u>defeat</u>. Loss of his office would result in the loss of his ministerial immunity from <u>prosecution for</u> <u>corruption</u>.

On July 25<sup>th</sup>, <u>IDF's Northern Command</u> and <u>the IAF</u> have announced full preparations for in invasion of Lebanon. Since then, several <u>world leaders have urged de-escalation</u> of the partial war between Hezbollah and Israel to avoid a wider conflict throughout the region.

On July 27<sup>th</sup>, a Falaq-1 rocket launched from Lebanon <u>struck a soccer field in the Druze village of</u> <u>Majdal Shams</u>, killing at least 12 civilians, most of whom were children. <u>Hezbollah</u> and <u>other Lebanese</u> <u>leaders</u> have denied Hezbollah's involvement, though both <u>Israel</u> and <u>the US</u> have claimed Hezbollah's responsibility in the strike. Since then, the Israeli government and military has <u>moved rapidly towards</u> <u>massive retaliatory escalation</u>, with widespread fears of <u>a full-scale war</u> to follow.

Israel is internally divided. It is at **Stage 6: Polarization**. Israel's planned invasion of Lebanon indicates that Israel is at **Stage 7: Preparation** for war and the crimes war will inevitably cause.

## **Genocide Watch Recommends:**

- Israel and Hamas must accept the <u>US and UN peace plan</u> and conclude the war in Gaza.
- The International Criminal Court should charge Hamas leaders for genocide in Israel.
- The ICC should prosecute Israeli leaders for the war crime of starvation of Palestinians.
- NATO states should impose Magnitsky sanctions on Israeli leaders for their war crimes in Gaza.
- The US should warn Israel that the US will cut off military aid if the IDF invades Lebanon.
